## Marlton Public School



This two room brick school, located on South Maple and Oak Avenue (now the Board of Education Administration Building), was built in 1878. In 1918, six rooms were added to the Marlton School. In 1930 four more rooms were added.

### Marlton Train Station



This train station was at the corner of Rt. 70 and Cooper Ave. The Haddonfield/ Marlton/Medford railroad was active for 50 years (1881-1931). Rt. 70 was laid on the bed of the rail road tracks.

## Marlton Fire Company No.1



Fire Company No. 1 was organized in 1898. This Historic Fire Station, built in 1927, now sits in back of the new station located at 26 East Main St. Marlton, NJ. In the past, Sparky the dog was a member of the fire team.
